## Step 1— Safety first.

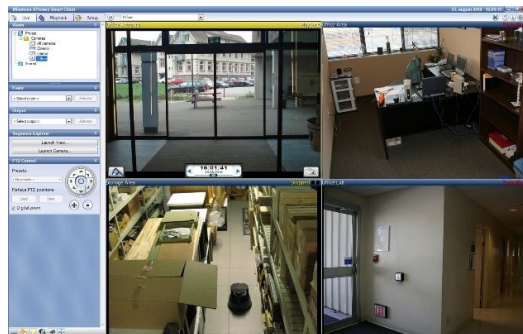
